chool Background: St. Joseph High School is a Catholic, college preparatory, co-educational high school sponsored by the Brothers of the Christian Schools. The mission and purpose of St. Joseph High School is to provide a quality, Lasallian education focused around an inclusive faith community and bolstered by a respect for all persons, with preference for the poor. The holistic educational experience students receive at St. Joseph High School equips them to act as informed contributors to society.

St. Joseph is accredited by the **North Central Association of Secondary Schools/AdvancED** and by the **Illinois Board of Education**. In 2015, St. Joseph High School completed an evaluation by the Quality Assurance Review Team of the North Central Association and was awarded the CASI/SACS Accreditation. St. Joseph High School is a member of the National Education Association, Christian Brothers Education Association, National Association for College Admission Counseling, Illinois High School Association, Chicago Catholic League, and Girls Catholic Athletic Conference.

Community: St. Joseph High School is located in Westchester, Illinois approximately 12 miles from downtown Chicago. However, the students of St. Joseph reside in over 22 surrounding communities including Westchester, Chicago, Cicero, Berwyn, Bellwood, Broadview, Glen Ellyn, Melrose Park, North Riverside, Oak Park, and the far reaching communities of Woodridge, Elgin and Bolingbrook. Currently, there are 185 students: 52 seniors, 43 juniors, 48 sophomores and 42 freshmen. The racial make-up of the school is 51% African-American, 6% Bi-racial/Asian, 13% Caucasian, and 28% Hispanic. There are 24 professional faculty with 54% having a Masters degree or beyond. There is one full-time school counselor.

chool Organization: 2020-2021 school year will consist of a hybrid model (2-days on campus, two days elearning and alternating 1/2 days on Fridays). The school year consists of two semesters with a total of four academic quarters. Each quarter is approximately nine weeks long. The school day begins at 8:00 AM and concludes at 2:30 PM. The day is divided into seven academic periods. St. Joseph High School offers three Advanced Placement courses, 22 Honors courses and a college preparatory program. Student placement is dependent on testing and teacher recommendation.

esting: 99% of the Class of 2020 completed the ACT test. Average ACT Score: 20.0.

raduate Profile: The 2020 graduating class consisted of 64 students with a 100% graduation rate. 67% are attending four-year colleges/universities (listed below), 24% attend two-year colleges (listed below) and 9% have entered the workforce, military or trades. The class of 2020 had five Illinois State Scholars, with 37% of the class receiving over \$5.0 million in scholarships.
